Described as “Southern-fried alt-law country,” Caddle draws on classic country and bluegrass influences, then supercharges them with a hard driving rock n’ roll attitude.

Caddle has shared the stage with artists such as Billy Joe Shaver, Kid Rock, David Allan Coe, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Travis Tritt, Molly Hatchet, Jeffrey Steele, The Black Crowes, Jason Aldean, Dale Watson, 3 Doors Down, Webb Wilder, Cross Canadian Ragweed, Confederate Railroad and Delbert McClinton to name a few.

“Raise ‘Em High,” Caddle’s newly released album, took home Album of the Year at the 2007 Birmingham Music Awards. Taking notice is Sirius Radio’s channel 63 Outlaw Country station, which recently added three cuts from “Raise ‘Em High,” along with traditional radio spins all over the Southeast.

“Simply put, this is music from the bottom of the guitar – down, dirty and just plain loud... And it only gets better from there.
